

Purge Your Spurge & Get Free Plants

Myrtle Spurge is a common garden plant, but it's illegal in Colorado. Pull myrtle spurge from your garden, bring it to **EcoCycle/ReSource** at 6400 Arapahoe Avenue between 9 a.m. and noon on Saturday, May 10, 2014 and we'll give you **FREE** native plants! How to Purge Spurge!

1. **WEAR** long sleeves, long pants, gloves and eye protection. Spurge contains white sap that can cause severe skin irritation, including blistering (another reason to get rid of it!).
2. **REMOVE** at least 4 inches of the root when pulling your spurge.
3. **BAG** the spurge and tie or fasten the bag closed. Never compost, since this could spread the weed when the compost is later used as mulch.
4. **TELL** your neighbors and friends to purge their spurge too. Everyone is welcome – Boulder County residents please purge your spurge and come get free plants too!
5. **BRING** your bags and get free native plants in return.

Did you know?

Myrtle Spurge is illegal to grow in the state of Colorado, and communities are being asked to eradicate this weed.*

Why?

Once this garden plant establishes itself in natural lands, it out-competes native plants and negatively impacts wildlife habitat.

*The Colorado Noxious Weed Act, 35-5.5-110/C.R.S. (2003), designates myrtle spurge as a "Class A" Noxious Weed that must be eradicated. It is a violation of this law to allow myrtle spurge to "produce seed or develop other reproductive propagules." To read the complete act, visit, ww.ag.state.co.us. Property owners are required to eliminate this weed from their properties.
