At its October 21st meeting, the City Council voted unanimously to require the property owners to reconstruct the contributing shed that was demolished without a Landmark Alteration Certificate.

Landmark Designation of 905 Marine Street, 1630 9th Street and 1622 9th Street

At its October 7th meeting, City Council adopted the resolutions to designate the properties at 905 Marine St., 1630 9th St., and 1622 9th St. as individual landmarks. The foundations are poured for the houses at 1630 9th St. and 1622 9th St.

Landmark Designation of 1919 14th Street

First reading occurred at the October 21st meeting with second reading scheduled for Nov. 6th.

Pending 12th St. Historic District Designation

On October 23rd, the first neighborhood meeting was held to discuss historic district designation of the 700 block of 12th St. Update at meeting.

Whittier School Class Presentation

2015 Certified Local Government Grant Application
