



BOND

The department received \$8.3 million to address maintenance and infrastructure deficiencies in high priority park locations. Sixty percent of the bond funding has been encumbered.*

CAPITAL

The Capital Improvement Projects contain planned project funding from standard revenue streams which are invested into key infrastructure and facilities.

Chautauqua Park

Improvements to the parking lot, drives and bus pull-out are complete.

East Boulder Community Park

Improvements were made to the water access within the dog park.

Elks Park

Construction for the development of Elks Park is underway. The September flood has heavily impacted the project.

Valmont City Park - Phase 1 Complete

Phase 1 includes the bike park, dog park and interim disc golf course. The final touches included installation of the last two bridges, a new maintenance shed and ongoing landscaping including 200 trees and over 700 shrubs.



PLANNING

Planning is a public engagement and decision-making process for development and general management of the park system.

Emma Gomez Martinez Park

Canyon Park was re-named Emma Gomez Martinez Park in honor of an outstanding member of the Boulder community.

2013 Master Plan Update

The 2013 Parks and Recreation Master Plan update was recommended by PRAB and the Planning Board in 2013. City Council is anticipated to accept the document in early 2014.

Admiral Arleigh A. Burke Park and Thunderbird Lake

The Parks and Recreation Department was awarded a \$100,000 grant from GOCO's School Play Yard Initiative for their partnership with Horizons K-8 School.

Holiday Park

Park staff joined the Holiday neighborhood to celebrate their community and the development of the North Boulder Sub-community Plan.



FLOOD

After a devastating flood that was declared a federal emergency, Boulder Parks and Recreation organized a five-week volunteer effort to help restore some of the major park and recreation sites.

Thanks in part to the 780 volunteers who gave over 2,300 hours of labor to the community, totaling over \$50,000 of labor, the Parks and Recreation Department has been able to open 95% of the parks and facilities within the system.

Local businesses also donated resources in support of the volunteer effort.
