



The Housing Authority for the City of Boulder, otherwise known as Boulder Housing Partners (BHP), was established by Colorado State Statute in 1966 and currently has a nine member Board of Commissioners, one of whom is a City Council Member and one of whom is elected by residents directly assisted by HUD. All members are appointed by the Mayor and serve for five years.

BHP helps execute city housing policy and it is our strong belief that we best serve the community when we stay focused on what we do well—producing and managing beautiful affordable homes for Boulder’s workforce, providing or partnering for services to families, persons living with disabilities and seniors in many of our properties, and housing residents through the provision of vouchers. BHP also partners with the City and the Boulder Shelter for the Homeless in the provision of Permanent Supportive Housing vouchers for residents exiting homelessness.

Since 2017, the City and BHP have partnered for the acquisition and preservation of 261 units of affordable housing and for the development of another 234 homes which are either already complete or under construction. Together, this equates to a 45% increase in the affordable housing options that BHP is able to provide in the Boulder Community and a substantial increase to the annual rent burden relief that we’re able to offer low income members of our community. In total, Boulder Housing Partners administers 1,241 housing vouchers that provide rental assistance in our community, and we manage just over 1,400 apartment homes throughout the City.

BHP’s Board is the governing Board for the organization, rather than a City Council Advisory Board. Board meetings are usually held the second Wednesday of the month from 9-11a.m. at BHP’s main office, 4800 North Broadway, with specific Committee meetings held the Monday before the Board meeting.
