

# Station 3 Sumac to Topaz - Path Connection Alternative Evaluation




### Background

The North Boulder Sub-Community Plan and Transportation Master Plan identify an off-street connection in the vicinity of Fourmile Canyon Creek from Topaz Drive to Sumac Avenue. The city is completing a Community and Environmental Assessment Process (CEAP) to consider two alignment options for a concrete surfaced multi-use path connection.
