



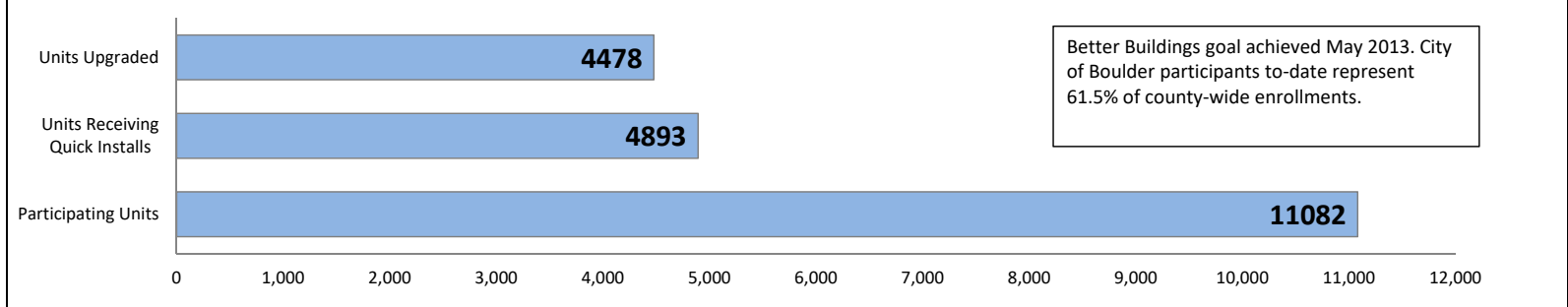
City of Boulder RESIDENTIAL EnergySmart Program-to-Date Progress Report



This page summarizes progress to date since October 2010 in achieving the goals of the EnergySmart services toward the Department of Energy Better Building Grant awarded to Boulder County. The Better Building Residential EnergySmart goal was to have 10,000 homes participate in the program by May 2013. EnergySmart was conceived and developed through a joint effort of Boulder County Commissioners' Office of Sustainability, Boulder County Public Health, City of Boulder and City of Longmont. RESIDENTIAL UNITS PARTICIPATING IN ENERGYSMART

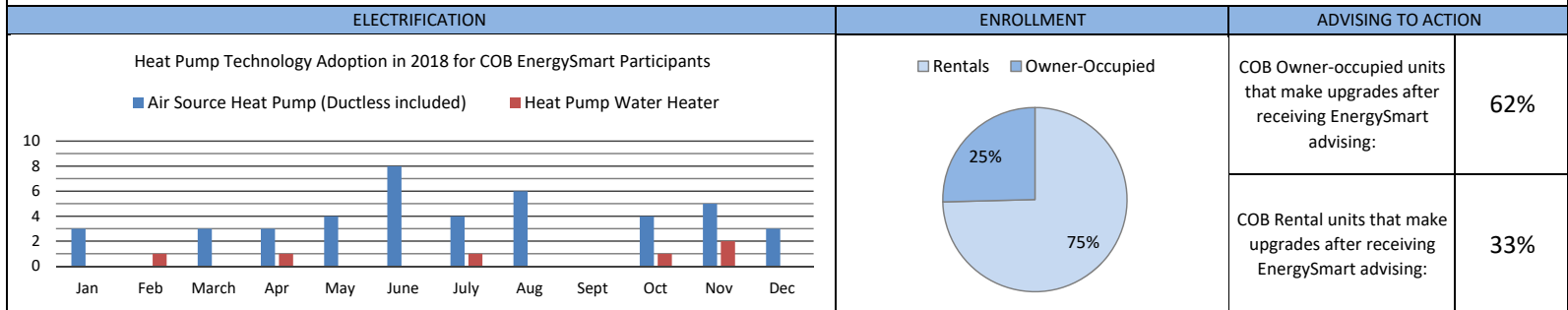

HIGHLIGHTS

- 37% of participants in EnergySmart across Boulder County cited energy cost savings as their primary reason to participate. 46% cited Smart Regs as their primary reason to participate.
- Attic/ceiling insulation and air sealing are the top two upgrades overall. 5 solar PV projects, 12 air source heat pump projects, and 3 heat pump water heater project were completed during Q4 2018 in Boulder.
- Each dollar spent on residential energy efficiency rebates from the EnergySmart partners leverages about \$9.42 in private investment. This ratio has consistently improved each quarter.
- From October 2018 - December 2018 there were 73 City of Boulder owner-occupied properties enrolled in EnergySmart providing an average of around 24 per month. Of these enrollments, 38 enrolled to comply with the COB Energy Code.
- County-wide 18,030 total residences are enrolled.
