



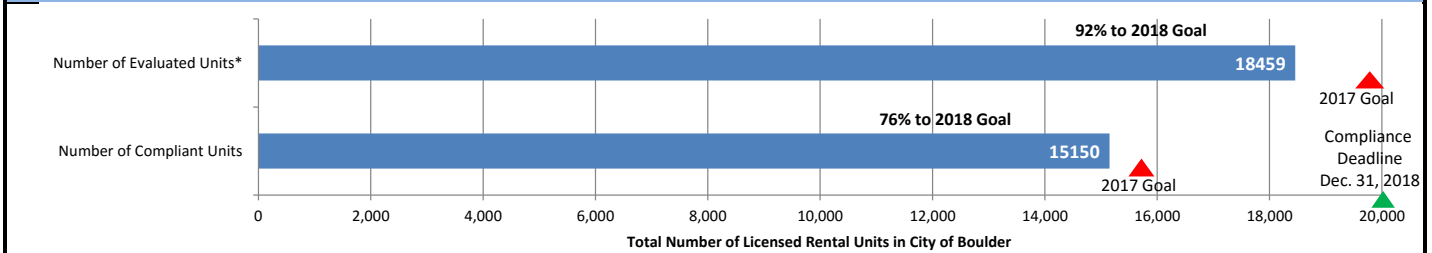
## SmartRegs Program-to-Date Progress Report

^ Exemptions include: ADUs and attached OAUs, mobile homes, new units/buildings permitted after July 19, 2001, and units that have received free weatherization through LPEC.
