



Colorado Safe Routes to School Program

This program was established by the Colorado Department of Transportation in 2005 to encourage students to walk and bike to school. Previously funded projects for the City of Boulder include:

- Linden Avenue Sidewalk Project
- Flatirons Elementary School Multi-Use Path
- Southern Hills Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements
- Fourmile Canyon Creek Multi-Use Path (26-28th streets)
- South Boulder Rd and Manhattan Dr Intersection Improvements
- Foothills Elementary School Sidewalk Project
- Lehigh Pedestrian Crossing Improvements
- Crossing Crew education and promotion
- Heads Up Crosswalk campaign

In 2014, the City of Boulder was awarded funding through the Colorado Safe Routes to School Program to complete a multi-use path along Hanover Avenue from Broadway to east of 46th Street.

Project Purpose

- Improve safety and accessibility for bicyclists and pedestrians on Hanover Avenue from Broadway to east of 46th Street.
- Support students walking and bicycling to area schools including Summit Middle School, Creekside Elementary School, Community Montessori and Southern Hills Middle School.
