








Howard Heuston Park



Starting May 1, the Parks and Recreation Department will have a contractor prune and remove trees in city parks, including Howard Heuston Park, and public street rights-of-way.

One of the primary goals for scheduling the tree work at this time is to coordinate pruning and removals prior to infrastructure installation.

This timing allows crews to minimize damage to new infrastructure, prevent the need to close park amenities at a future date, and save funds by packaging the tree work into a larger contract.
