

**REGULATION TO CREATE
THE HIGH/SUNSET NEIGHBORHOOD PERMIT PARKING (NPP) ZONE**

Having found that the proposed zone has met all of the requirements set forth in Section 2-2-15, of the B.R.C., 1981, and the requirements of the adopted Neighborhood Permit Parking Program Regulations, I declare that the High/Sunset Neighborhood Permit Parking (NPP) zone includes the following block faces:

2324 through 2340 14th Street; the 1400, 1500 and 1600 blocks of High Street, north and south; the 1400 block of Sunset Blvd. (east and west); the 1500, 1600, and 1700 blocks of Sunset Blvd. (north and south).

The zone will be designated with a "color-code" restriction on public parking as defined in the Neighborhood Permit Parking Program Regulations, in effect on May 30, 1997. Signs will be posted throughout the zone that read: 2 Hour Parking, One Time Only Per Day, 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday, In This Orange Zone, Except by Permit.

Up to two commuter permits per block face will be available for purchase by non-zone residents on a quarterly basis. Commuter permits will be allocated to individuals by a lottery held every two years beginning in 1997.
