2014 Highlights

RECIPROCAL MAYORAL EXCHANGE IN BOULDER

Following an invitation from the Lhasa Municipal Government, Shaun McGrath, then Mayor of Boulder, led a Boulder delegation of six to Lhasa in October 2008 for a one-week mayoral exchange to strengthen the Boulder-Lhasa sister city relationship.

Following an invitation from Boulder-Lhasa Sister City Project (BLSCP), Madam Tsering Yangzom, Deputy Mayor of Lhasa, led a Lhasa delegation of six to Boulder on 10-13 November 2014 for a reciprocal mayoral exchange. The Mayor of Lhasa had planned to lead the delegation but had to cancel his participation, due to his participation in another overseas visit in November as assigned by the Tibet Autonomous Region Government. The purpose of the exchange was to promote friendship between Boulder and Lhasa and to seek a better understanding of each other. BLSCP accepted an offer from the Lhasa Municipal Government to pay for its own trip expenses, including air tickets, local transportation, lodging, and some meals. The Lhasa delegation was:
