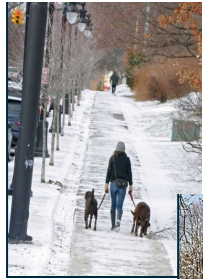


## Cappuccino Mix

- 3 1/2 cups dry milk
- 2 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 1/2 cups coca powder
- 1 tsp. cinnamon

Mix all ingredients. Use one teaspoon per 6 ounce cup of hot water.



## Hot Mulled Cider

- 1/2 tsp. whole allspice
- 1/2 tsp. whole cloves
- 1 stick cinnamon
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 1/2 cup cranberry juice
- 1 qt. apple cider

In 2 quart casserole combine all ingredients. Cover, microwave on high 5-8 minutes or until hot, then stir.

## Make it Clear



When winter's first snowflakes begin to blanket the ground in Colorado, it's the start of a joyous season for skiers and snowboarders at Colorado's 25 ski resorts.

They're not the only outdoor adventurers who eagerly await the winter months. Colorado's sun-soaked skies, powder-filled valleys and snow-capped peaks make it a winter wonderland filled with fun things to do, like snowmobiling, tubing, ice skating, snowshoeing and much more.



## Keeping People Safe

Boulder is a community filled with families and professionals enjoying all the events, education, shopping, and working hard everyday. As one of the most transit-diverse communities in the state, with residents walking, biking and taking advantage of our mass transit stops year round, snow and ice on the sidewalks poses a real safety hazard should it not be removed in a timely manner.



## Doing Your Part

All owners or residents of private property must have the snow and ice on their sidewalks cleared within 24 hours after it stops snowing per BRC 8-2-13. Shoveling sidewalks helps prevent accidents and increases accessibility for pedestrians.

View the National Weather Service reports at: <http://www.nws.noaa.gov/data/obhistory/KBDU.html> or contact Code Enforcement at 303-441-3333 to determine when it stopped snowing. Look for the last recording of light snow or snow will indicate the snowfall has stopped.

Residents on corner lots need to clear the sidewalks on both the front and side of the property as well as the pedestrian pans leading to the street. The entire width of the sidewalks or a width of 5' is required to be cleared.



If your sidewalk is adjacent to a snow plow route, please wait until the snow plows have cleared the streets before shoveling. Plows may need to push snow onto curbs and sidewalks to keep the streets clear.

To report sidewalk snow removal violations, call Code Enforcement at 303-441-3333.

## IceBusters

Senior citizens and physically disabled persons who are unable to clear

snow from their sidewalks may receive assistance through the city's IceBusters Program. Volunteers are always needed to help with this and other valuable programs. Please consider helping those in need in your community by calling the Boulder County Care Connect and becoming a valued volunteers.

## Enforcement

Boulder's Code Enforcement Unit will issue only one warning per snow season (Oct-May) requesting that the sidewalk be maintained clear of snow and ice. Any subsequent violations could result in a summons to persons failing to comply with the snow removal ordinance and/or abatement of the violation. If abatement is used to remove snow and ice, the property owner is assessed the cost of removal plus a \$50 fee. The fine for a first offense summons is \$100, with a maximum fine is \$1,000.
