

## **Marc Schlossberg – Bio**

Marc Schlossberg, PhD is a Professor of City and Regional Planning and co-director of the Sustainable Cities Initiative (SCI) at the University of Oregon. His teaching, research, and community engagement focus on sustainable transportation, livable community design, and the processes that can accelerate implementation of more sustainable policy and practice. Professor Schlossberg recently co-published, [Rethinking Streets: An Evidence-Based Guide to 25 Complete Street Transformations](#), which has been downloaded over 5,000 times and is currently being used by practitioners policy makers, and classrooms (<http://rethinkingstreets.com/>) in over 20 countries.

As Co-Director of SCI, Professor Schlossberg has helped pioneer a new, massively scaled university-community partnership program that is currently being adapted by over 25 other universities, including CU-Denver and the Technion in Israel. This NY Times called this model "perhaps the most comprehensive effort by a U.S. university to infuse sustainability into its curricula and community outreach".

Schlossberg is a founding Executive Committee member of the National Institute for Transportation and Communities (NITC), one of five national University Transportation Centers in the United States.

He has received two distinguished Fulbright Scholarships during his tenure as a Professor (United Kingdom and Israel) to focus on both active transportation issues and new pedagogical models. Prior to academia, Marc worked in the nonprofit sector and was a U.S Peace Corps volunteer in Fiji.
