

From August 10, 2015 through November 2015, the City of Boulder Annual Sidewalk Repair Program will be making sidewalk repairs and curb access ramp upgrades to the University Hill neighborhood (see map below).

The Boulder Revised Code, Section 8-2-6, states that it is the property owner's responsibility to maintain the sidewalks on or adjacent to their property in a safe and unobstructed condition.

The City of Boulder has implemented the Annual Sidewalk Repair Program to partner with property owners to make the necessary repairs for safer and more walkable sidewalks and to provide curb access ramps that meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines. Please see the Program Information Sheet which describes how damaged sidewalks are selected for repair or replacement, cost sharing, and construction timing and impacts. Note that the City will install ADA compliant curb ramps at intersections, as needed, at no additional cost to the property owner.

The city employed an engineering consultant to examine all sidewalks within the University Hill neighborhood to identify sidewalks in need of repair -- a map of the anticipated sidewalk repairs can be viewed at the public meeting and may also be found here:
