




North Boulder Subcommunity Plan Update



Join Us for the North Boulder Walk Audit

Please join city staff from GO Boulder and the Community Planning + Sustainability Department on **Thursday, April 24th from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m.** for the North Boulder Subcommunity Plan update Walk Audit. The Walk Audit is part of the Boulder Walks program, a new initiative to encourage walking and build awareness of what contributes to a walk friendly community.

This Walk Audit will explore the various walking environments along Broadway north of Violet. It is an opportunity to evaluate the present environment and envision potential ways to enhance the future walking experience for people of all ages and stages of life.

Participants will become acquainted with how the relationship between land use and streetscape design can support a walk friendly community. Participants can document their observations through photos, videos and field notes to help guide policies and practices for improving walking conditions throughout Boulder.

Other Related Projects: **Transportation Master Plan Update**

The Transportation Master Plan (TMP) is the Community's blueprint for creating safe and sustainable transportation options that meet the needs of the community and increase accessibility. This update of TMP provides the policy basis for how transportation funding is spent, and what projects or programs the city focuses on to provide transportation services through the year 2035. Developing Transit Scenarios

A key component of the TMP update is a Renewed Vision for Transit. During the Listening and Learning phase, Boulderites shared ideas for how to improve Boulder Transit System at www.BoulderTransitDesign.com. Drawing from what we heard, the transit team developed four different scenarios to demonstrate different strategies and weigh the cost and benefits of various approaches to creating a complete transit system in Boulder. Boulder's Living Laboratory

The City began a Boulder Walks program to learn what makes a good pedestrian environment and a series of pilot projects to test new bicycle facility treatments. These initiatives comprise a Living Laboratory approach of engaging community members in studying innovations to explore which are appropriate for Boulder. With respect to bicycling, the city has installed several new facility treatments to increase safety and appeal for people who want to bike but don't feel comfortable or confident sharing the roadway with motor vehicle traffic.
