

AQUATIC FEASIBILITY PLAN - DESCRIPTION

What is an Aquatic Feasibility Plan?

The purpose of the Aquatic Feasibility Plan is to:

- Provide a condition assessment of current aquatic facilities and infrastructure
- Evaluate current and anticipated demand for aquatic facilities in Boulder as well as the current and future supply to meet demands
- Provide case studies and industry best practices for aquatic facility development and management
- Develop scenarios and recommendations for Boulder to ensure vibrant and innovative aquatic facilities and management strategies
- Provide conceptual cost estimating for capital and operating associated with recommended scenarios

Why is Parks and Recreation doing an Aquatic Feasibility Plan?

During extensive public outreach processes associated with developing long-range plans, community members indicated a desire for additional aquatic facilities in Boulder.

Long-range Plans referenced:

- 2005 Parks and Recreation Master Plans
- 2008 Valmont City Park Master Plan
- 2010 Recreation Program and Facilities Plan
- 2014 Parks and Recreation Master Plan

Based on a recommendation in the 2014 Master Plan, Boulder Parks and Recreation will complete a thorough Aquatics Feasibility Plan scheduled to be completed in February 2015.
