



Chautauqua Meadow Rehabilitation Project



Beginning in late August, 2014, Open Space & Mountain Parks crews will begin restoring the Chautauqua Meadow trails as outlined in the West Trail Study Area Plan.

The project will improve the long-term health and sustainability of the Chautauqua Meadow for future generations of Boulder residents and visitors.



What's happening here:

- Surfacing trails with crusher fines (a gravel product).
- Re-grading trails to reduce erosion.
- Reducing the number of redundant parallel trails.

Why:

- Eliminate muddy trail conditions.
- Reduce trail erosion.
- Reduce braiding and widening of trails.
- Reduce negative impacts on vegetation.

When:

- August 25th - early December 2014
- Crews will work Monday - Friday, 8 am to 5 pm.

Pardon our dust!

- Work will generally be limited to 1-2 trails at a time.
- Occasional short-term trail closures will be necessary. Detours will be available.
- Machinery will be present.
- You may see short-term impacts to vegetation due to trail construction activities.

We thank you for cooperation and patience during this project. This project was identified by Community Collaborative Groups and approved by City Council in the West Trail Study Area Plan.
