

FOCUS AREAS

- Strengthen the city's affordable housing programs for low- and middle-income households.
- Expand housing opportunities for middle-income households.
- Explore innovative approaches to provide additional housing and a broader range of housing options, particularly for housing needs that are not being met by the market.

In the past decades, Boulder's parking system has evolved into a nationally recognized, district-based **access** system that incorporates all modes of travel, including walking, biking, transit and driving. AMPS will develop overarching policies, programs, and tools to create an access management and parking system for the future that helps achieve the community's sustainability goals.
