Dear Mr. Hendricks:

Analysis by our laboratory of a sample of the material referenced in our letter to you of February 15, 1983 indicates that EPA toxic limits for a hazardous waste are exceeded for cadmium and lead. While EPA standards don't presently apply to mine waste we feel that it is inappropriate to add this material to the existing radioactive waste at your site and hereby withdraw your authorization to receive it for disposal.
