TRAINING REQUIRED FOR LICENSING

In Colorado classes required to obtain a family child care license may be taken from approved trainer in the state.

- A list of approved Boulder County training and trainers is enclosed
- A statewide list of approved trainers is included in the Application Packet For Family Child Care Homes
- Visit the on-line training calendar at www.qualistar.org

The four classes listed below are required to obtain a family child care license. See enclosed flyers for details.

- **PRE-LICENSING TRAINING** (21 hrs) — is offered three times a year and includes Universal Precautions.
- **UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS** (1.5 hrs) — is offered five times a year and is included as part of the Boulder County Pre-licensing training. This class may also be taken separately.
- **FIRST AID & CPR** (4 hrs each) — is offered by several trainers in Boulder County.
- **MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION** (4 hrs) — is offered in Boulder and Broomfield counties.

Orientation to Family Child Care

Interested in becoming a licensed family child care provider?

Is family child care the right profession for you? What are the costs and benefits of becoming licensed?

This optional orientation will provide you with an overview of the licensing process and information about the training required to become a licensed provider in the state of Colorado. Participants will receive a **Family Child Care Home Application Packet (\$22 value)** containing a Department of Human Services application, finger print cards, health evaluation form and the rules that regulate the licensing of family child care homes.

Pre-licensing training begins two weeks after the orientation workshops are held. To get ready for licensing in time for summer enrollment, take the January workshop; for fall enrollment, take the May workshop; and for the new year, you should take the September workshop.

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
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Required Training to Become A Licensed Family Child Care Provider

The State of Colorado Rules Regulating Family Child Care Homes requires that the primary caregiver of a licensed family child care home complete the following training to receive a permanent license. All classes must be complete prior to the licensing inspection of the home.

Pre-licensing must be completed prior to the licensing visit. This training provides the information needed to prepare for the licensing inspection. If for some reason a class is missed the provider must make the class up prior to receiving a license.

To receive a regular 6+2 family child care license the primary provider must physically reside at the family child care home, must provide the child care and complete the following minimum training requirements from an approved trainer.

- Pre-licensing – minimum of 15 clock hours
- Universal Precautions – minimum of 1.5 clock hours
- First Aid – usually 3-4 clock hours
- CPR – usually 3-4 clock hours
- Medication Administration – minimum of 4 clock hours

To receive an infant/toddler license the primary care giver must live in the home, complete the above basic training requirements

AND

- The primary provider must complete the State Department approved Expanding Quality Infant/Toddler (EQ/IT) course of training or 3 credit college level class in infant/toddler development and care giving practices prior to receiving the license. www.eccbouldercounty.org/
- The primary caregiver must be at least 21 years of age. Other caregivers must be at least 18 years of age. Each caregiver must have one year of supervised experience caring for children under the age of three years.

To receive a large home license there are additional training requirements that must be met by the primary provider. See regulation 7.707.31.C for details. In addition the licensee may need to obtain prior approval from the local zoning or planning department for more children than is usually allowed as use-by-right. For example: City of Louisville or Lafayette, Town of Erie, Boulder County etc.

Zoning Approval

All applicants for a new family child care license or a change in the type of license must show a letter from the local zoning or planning department that includes the address of the home and the number of children allowed by local zoning ordinances.

INITIAL EXPENSES TO OBTAIN A FAMILY CHILD CARE LICENSE

\$The cost of fingerprinting each adult member (anyone 18 or older) of your household varies depending on where the fingerprints are taken. See attached handout on where, when and the cost of fingerprints.

\$The cost of running a Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) background check for each person age 18 or older in your household: \$17.50

\$The cost of running an FBI background check for each person age 18 or older in your household: \$22.00

\$The cost of physical examinations for every member of your household, unless they are current within the last six months

\$The application fee of \$24.00 to the Colorado Dept. of Human Services

\$The cost of First Aid & CPR (\$50.00) and Medication Administration training (\$45.00), however this cost can vary depending on the vendor.

\$The cost of the 21 hours of Pre-licensing training (includes Universal Precautions and Child Abuse Reporting) is \$40.00 for City of Boulder residents, \$65.00 for all other Boulder County residents, \$90.00 for people who do not live in Boulder County.

\$Additional costs will vary for each home and might include physicals, fencing, baby proofing or making necessary safety alterations to the home. Toys, books, art supplies, play equipment and other equipment such as cribs, high chairs, rest mats, child size tables and chairs etc. suitable for the ages and numbers of children in care may be needed.

The data presented is based on a survey conducted July – November, 2012 128 child care centers and school age sites in Boulder County. 127 surveys were completed (99% completion rate).

Programs not included in the survey were: 32 part-time only preschool programs (privately owned), 83 part-time school district programs (preschool, kindergarten enrichment programs and SACC), 17 private schools that are tuition based, 7 federally subsidized Head Start program, 6 programs that have sliding scale fees, and 2 drop-in programs.







Participants in this program will:

- Receive matching funds to help save for a down payment on a home
- Attend money management training and homeownership course
- Earn a 4 to 1 match to savings, for example, receive \$100 for every \$25 saved

To qualify for the PIE program, an individual must fulfill the following:

1. Minimum age of eighteen (18)
2. Meet income eligibility guidelines
3. Maximum household net assets of \$10,000 (First home and first vehicle do not count as an asset)
4. Resident of Boulder or Broomfield County (one year minimum)
5. Social Security Number
6. Participants must work 30 hours per week unless permanently disabled, elderly, receiving TANF, or full-time student head of household.

Post-Secondary Education

Obtaining a post-high school education or vocational training can help improve job, career and life opportunities. **Personal Investment Enterprise's** Education Savings Program assists participants in saving money for a post-high school degree or entering a certified job training program.

Participants in this program will:

- Save toward an education in a chosen field of interest
- Attend money management training and receive academic counseling
- Earn a 4 to 1 match to savings, for example, receive \$100 for every \$25 saved

Small Business Development

Owning a small business can provide people with economic independence and the opportunity to increase their income. The Small Business Development component of **Personal Investment Enterprise** helps participants save towards the purchase or development of their own small business.

Participants in this program will:

- Receive matching funds to help save towards starting or building a small business
- Attend a small business Start Up training course and develop a sound, concept business
- Earn a 4 to 1 match to savings, for example, receive \$100 for every \$25 saved
